WebAssign Problem Setting Information Math 142 - Spring 2016

- 1. Each individual problem can be attempted six times total, all without penalty. It is important that you don't use ALL six attempts on your first pass at the homework set before the inital due date, or you will not have any attempts left if you need to try the problem again before the final due date.
- 2. If you want to know how many attempts at an answer you've already made, you can click on the link "Previous Answers" next to the problem number. This link will open a new window that shows you all of your previous attempts at an answer.
- 3. After the final due date occurs, you are eligible to ask WebAssign for an extension. I have set the first four requests for an extension to be granted automatically. If you do request an extension, any new credit you earn through the extension will be penalized by 10%. (So if you ask for 3 extensions, your newly earned credit on that extension is penalized by 30%.) You will have three days from the time you request the extension to complete the problems.
 - IT IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE that if you've already used all six attempts on a single problem, that you won't have any new attempts available to you via an extension. You have six attempts per problem TOTAL, always. Asking for an extension does not give you more attempts, it just gives you more time to complete your homework.
- 4. If it has been more than 15 day past the final due date, extensions will not be granted automatically, but will have to be requested of me manually. You can still do this through WebAssign, but WebAssign will notify me and I will have to clear it manually.
